THE KOORALBYN VALLEY

HISTORY

The original settler was John 'Tinker' Campbell and the property formed part of the Tamrookum Run in the early 1840s. William Barker subsequently owned the property and employed James Stephens, Queensland's first poet, as a private tutor for his family and it was at Kooralbyn that his first poem, "Convict Once" was written.

In 1890 William Cochrane Bundock bought the property, at the going rate of 29 shillings per acre. Over the next 43 years, it remained in the Bundock family and was developed to its full potential as grazing land.

In 1973 the idea of the "The Kooralbyn Resort" was born when two Sydney Knights – Sir Peter Abeles and Sir Arthur George, acquired the land in concert with others including financiers, planners, and marketers, all dreaming of a totally new concept in tourism, hospitality and community living that could benefit everyone. A place where guests could get away from the "rat race" of the major cities and escape to this tranquil inland oasis and relax.

By 1979 the first phase of the building construction was underway and the project was taken over by AGC, a subsidiary of Westpac, Australia's largest financier at the time. AGC completed the first phase and positioned "The Kooralbyn Resort" as Australia's first Integrated Golf Resort.

In 1988 the property was acquired by a large Japanese hotel group, Towa, who successfully managed the property until 2002 when it was acquired by New Zealand hotel operator Ray Schofield, before closing in 2008 due to its financier, MFS, going into receivership in the wake of the Global Financial Crisis. The Resort was dearly missed by the local community and repeat guests that had frequented the Resort during its former glory period.

LEGEND REBORN

Fortunately, Brisbane-based Yong Real Estate Group founder, Peter Huang, eventually purchased the property in 2013 – for the first time in history, the Resort is owned by a Queenslander. Over \$30m have been invested since then to restore the property to its former beauty.

The Resort and Golf Course successfully reopened in June 2016, offering dozens of more guest activities that can be incorporated into your stay.

MAKE LIFE A RIDE

CORNER MARKING

MANY RIDES WILL UTILISE CORNER MARKING.

- The Ride Leader will indicate, by pointing, a safe location where he/she would like the rider directly behind him/her to mark a corner.
- The corner marker should stop in a safe place that is visible to following riders, indicate with the turn signal to following riders the route and remain in position until Tail End Charlie indicates to re-join the ride. Re-join the ride safely.
- If there are inexperienced riders the corner marker may need to wait for a while but remember other riders' enjoyment is dependent on your effort.
- Corner marking is utilised to allow a ride to progress in an orderly and systematic way regardless of factors that could cause a disrupted ride.
- Some of these factors include the following.
- A wide range of rider experience that would cause frustration to more experienced riders by frequently stopping to allow slower riders to catch up.
- Traffic conditions, e.g. frequent traffic lights, or congestion, that cause the ride to break up into groups that lose touch with one another.
- Some riders who just want to "amble" along having a leisurely ride while others go ahead.
- More often than not, especially on mid-week rides, the ride leader will decide that ride members have similar experience and ability and so corner marking can be dispensed with. This means that the ride leader needs to be able to see following riders in his/her mirrors and may prevent the ride breaking up by introducing occasional stops.

THE RIDE GUIDE

Our branch rides are all about the journey and sharing experiences and fellowship with branch riders and visitors. We should be aware of the varying experience of riders on the day and make allowances for that. In appreciation of the range of bikes and the range of rider experience we ask that each rider to do the following.

- Arrive with a full tank of fuel and an empty bladder.
- Complete the Ride Register, it is for your own safety
- Listen to the briefing by the Ride Leader.
- Know who Tail End Charlie is and what bike they are riding.
- Keep a safe distance at all times - the 3 second rule is a good guide.
- Ride responsibly, obey road rules and ride at the pace that matches your own ability and skill level.
- Do not pass the Ride Leader unless the ride leader has indicated that this is acceptable. If you do pass without approval you are on your own.
- Overtake only in a different lane.
- if you leave the ride notify the Tail End Charlie and/or The Ride Leader (preferably both); and

If a visitor or new member make sure that the Ride Leader and Tail End Charlie are aware of the bike you are riding and your riding experience and ability.

From Lyn Dyne

On 8th July BMW celebrated the return of the Festival of Speed with its all new 2 Series Coupé at Goodwood UK on its famous 1.16-mile course. Also on display was the fastest and most powerful BMW M production car, the new BMW M5 CS as well as two new electric vehicles, the iX and i4.

On display at the stand trackside was the **M 1000 RR**, the new **R 18**, including the Spirit of Passion by Kingston Custom and custom bikes from Bernhard Naumann and the Custom Works ZON team from Japan. Visitors were able to race virtually, under hyper-realistic conditions, with a sim racing simulator.

In 2020 the BMW Group sold over 2.3 million passenger vehicles and more than 169,000 motorcycles worldwide.

Due to the recent severe weather which has seen thousands of people lose their livelihoods in parts of Germany, the BMW Group is making 1.5 million euros available to various rescue organisations that are providing emergency aid in affected regions
