

CORNER MARKING

MANY RIDES WILL UTILISE CORNER MARKING.

- The Ride Leader will indicate, by pointing, a safe location where he/she would like the **rider directly behind him/** her to mark a corner.
- The corner marker should stop in a safe place that is visible to following riders, indicate with the turn signal to following riders the route and <u>remain in position until Tail End Charlie indicates to re-join the ride</u>. Re-join the ride safely.
- If there are inexperienced riders the corner marker may need to wait for a while but remember other riders' enjoyment is dependent on your effort.
- Corner marking is utilised to allow a ride to progress in an orderly and systematic way regardless of factors that could cause a disrupted ride.
- Some of these factors include the following.
- A wide range of rider experience that would cause frustration to more experienced riders by frequently stopping
 to allow slower riders to catch up.
- Traffic conditions, e.g. frequent traffic lights, or congestion, that cause the ride to break up into groups that lose touch with one another.
- Some riders who just want to "amble" along having a leisurely ride while others go ahead.
- More often than not, especially on mid-week rides, the ride leader will decide that ride members have similar experience and ability and so corner marking can be dispensed with. This means that the ride leader needs to be able to see following riders in his/her mirrors and may prevent the ride breaking up by introducing occasional stops.

THE RIDE GUIDE

Our branch rides are all about the journey and sharing experiences and fellowship with branch riders and visitors. We should be aware of the varying experience of riders on the day and make allowances for that. In appreciation of the range of bikes and the range of rider experience we ask that each rider to do the following.

- Arrive with a full tank of fuel and an empty bladder.
- Complete the Ride Register, it is for your own safety
- Listen to the briefing by the Ride Leader.
- Know who Tail End Charlie is and what bike they are riding.
- Keep a safe distance at all times the 3 second rule is a good guide.
- Ride responsibly, obey road rules and ride at the pace that matches your own ability and skill level.
- Do not pass the Ride Leader unless the ride leader has indicated that this is acceptable. If you do pass without approval you are on your own.
- Overtake only in a different lane.
- if you leave the ride notify the Tail End Charlie and/or The Ride Leader (preferably both); and

If a visitor or new member make sure that the Ride Leader and Tail End Charlie are aware of the bike you are riding and your riding experience and ability.

Mapleton Ríde Report

Dubbed "the last ride before the border reopens", may prove to be wishful thinking if the confusion around border re-entry protocols isn't quickly sorted. What I did get right in the description was that it had to happen now before things got too hot and we fluked the weather (or was it just brilliant planning).

The prestart ride was well managed by Steve and Gordon (and of course navigator El supremo, Jenny) who escorted the GC residents, John and new members

Heather and Peter from exit 54 to Revolution Café at Caboolture. There waiting was Greg, Donna and myself. Others who were to come pulled out on reading the ever reliable weather forecast of biblical rains. This forecast didn't seem to gel with the perfect blue skies and temperature of mostly mid 20's. Steve had ridden up to enjoy our company over a coffee before being the dutiful son he is and going off to visit his folks at Redcliffe. Gordon commented afterwards that we had



a great ride after Steve left, I think he was referring more to the chronological sequence of events.

I have found a great sneaky route via Bellmere and then onto Mt Mee, but before taking the Bellmere road, I thought it would be good to lead the group on a little journey through the residential back blocks of that area of Caboolture, before getting onto Bellmere Road, if you cant see where you have turned then it doesn't constitute a U-Turn.

A Blast From The Past Women Motor Cyclists

Victorian Women Motor Cyclists Hold a Successful Outing

On Saturday, 27th October, a number of women motor cyclists joined forces for a run together, the route being to Warrandyte.

A raging dusty north wind made the journey unpleasant until the road led to the sheltering hills through the Yarra Valley.

Miss Crawford rode a 4 h.p. Precision with sidecar, and showed great dexterity in the manner in which she handled her fixed engine mount.

Miss B. Mainwarring, on a 1915 gearboxless Indian, carried Mr. Kerr as a pillion rider, and by high speed work made up loss of time occasioned by a double puncture, caused simultaneously by a nail and a tack. Miss Mainwarring has touched 60 miles per hours on this mount, and is desirous of the club timing her officially on the Werribee Road.

Miss Constance Duncan, on one of the new Indian creations-a Flat Twin-was amongst the first batch to arrive. She is an enthusiastic rider, and has graduated from a two-stroke, on which she put up some double donkey stunts. She very soberly recounts a hurricane stunt around the University grounds with a professor's wife on the carrier.

Miss M. Nylander is a young old hand. She has driven her Indian and sidecar over many miles of Victorian roads and handles her machine with the technique of an expert.

Miss Keast rides an Indian Flat Twin, and, although she had not ridden even a pedi-cycle prior to joining the ranks of the petrol army, she gave a good illustration of the rapidity with which the modern motorcycle can be mastered.

Miss Allen, who is another expert motor cyclist, was unable to join in the run.

Miss Holst, who drives a 'Douglas and a Talbot car, was away rifle shooting and was also unable to attend.

Miss Emms (B.S.A.) was away at the V.M.C. hill climb. This event clashed with the womens'run.

Miss Fraser accepted a challenge to drive Mr. Rhodes' Indian and sidecar outfit and handled the machine with apparent ease and confidence.

Mrs Rhodes had an opportunity of showing whether a woman can handle a spanner when an oil lead was dismantled to draw off some lubricant for one of the machines which was short of oil.

A convoy of 5 male riders swallowed the dust from the girl riders, who speeding ahead like dusty whirlwinds, showed that the open road is no longer closed to unattended women. Breeches and leggings have become almost the universal attire for the modern outdoor woman.

The women had time to soliloquise on the great changes which have taken place in women's outlook on living. Today powder and patches have been replaced with sun tan and smudges of clean road dust; studied coiffeur has been supplanted by loose, 'sun-kist' hair.

The riders gathered at the finish of the outward run and had tea at Yarra Bend, Warrandyte.

The oldest residents, once shocked by the divided skirt of the cycle days, blinked furiously as the smart riders headed home citywards.

maximum of 7.5 W (1.5 A at 5 V). An LED charging indicator (can be switched off) provides information about the phone's charging status.

For security, the ConnectedRide Cradle can be locked to the motorcycle's holder, if the holder supports this.

The ConnectedRide Cradle can also be used on older BMW Motorrad models (e.g. BMW R 1200 GS K50) and fits all BMW Motorrad models equipped with the optional equipment "Preparation for navigation system (option 272)" - as well as models equipped with Multi-Controller and the option of retrofitting the navigation preparation via the BMW Motorrad workshop system (except R 1200 RT, R 1250 RT, K 1600 models). On older motorcycles without a TFT instrument cluster, operation is possible via the control element of the "Preparation for navigation unit SA 272". The prerequisite for displaying vehicle data is "On-board computer Pro (option 221)". The ConnectedRide Cradle cannot be used with the Navigator 4-Button Mount Cradle.

In order to be able to fully use the functions described, the BMW Motorrad Connected App version 4.0 or higher must be used. BMW Motorrad recommends that you always install the latest updates to ensure proper functioning.

A Bluetooth connection is required to enable the app to be controlled via the motorcycle's navigation preparation control element. The smartphone must be equipped with Bluetooth Low Energy version 4.2 at least in order to comply with the security requirements (LE Secure Connections) for the connection. Smartphones with older Bluetooth versions are therefore not supported.

Bluetooth pairing takes place within the BMW Motorrad Connected App and is only required once during initial setup.
