2022 National Motorrad Rally Overview

Well that year went fast; seemed like only a few weeks ago the BMW Motorcycle Owners Club Gold Coast was at Condobolin and offering to host the 2022 National Motorrad Rally. In that time the club members and some behind the scenes superhero's, worked through the various Covid, border, accommodation and staffing restrictions that kept changing. I know a few breathed a sigh of relief when the club put out the welcome mat to over 80 attendees that made their way to Kooralbyn.





It had always been hoped that the Scenic Rim would justify the effort of riding from interstate. The area is in our backyard and it easy to take it for granted, but the Weather Gods really helped showcase the area.

The Kooralbyn Resort provided a central point for all activities and having everyone in the same area just meant an immediate connection with BMW riders known and those we were yet to know.

The event started down at "The Shed" where a welcome pack and drinks were available; looking at the amount of cleaning products in the pack I was wondering if someone was trying to give me the hint. The scarf was certainly a thoughtful addition as we locals thought it a bit chilly. Interesting to watch a couple of the deep southerners out and about in shorts during the weekend.

Dinner was a buffet both nights and a great chance to mingle. After dinner, a large open fire was raging, and many took the opportunity to gather around and look at the starry sky and compare ride stories. The wise ones left early to prepare for the organised rides the next day.

Saturday broke to a clear bright sky and 2degrees. For those in "Show & Shine" this meant a trip to the bike to wipe off the frost and condensation and then to come back 5 minutes later and do it all over again. Judging was a very serious process undertaken by one of our sponsors and Gold Coast Member young Nic Mercieca (SMART MOTO) and John Simpson (AKA The Old Fart). There were a number of categories with the respective winners being Cindy Bennett BMW MC Qld for people's choice, GS Model Frank Hills BMW MC Qld, the K Model Gerald Wright BMW Touring Club of NSW and for a very pretty R model Lou Baljak from BMW MOC Gold Coast.



That and breakfast out of the way, a pre-ride briefing before 5 different ride groups headed off for various destinations starting from 9am. Four were bitumen, but Steve Bryant led an off-road ride and it was pleasing to see the number of riders following, even better when the same number returned. The heavy rains over the last few months had caused changes to ride routes due to road



closures or bitumen routes more resembling a serious off-road challenge. As late as 2 weeks ago it was decided one of the off-road routes was still too difficult for even accomplished riders. With the bikes away, the Resort was once again peaceful and serious thought could be given to lunch options. There were several ladies not riding and it was decided they would partake of a

Ladies Lunch down at the Copper Kettle. John Vanzino and I were given temporary female designation and attended what was a most enjoyable and entertaining lunch. Of course, what is said at lunch stays at lunch, but I felt less stressed on a tough off-road ride than I did trying to keep up with the conversations and not get into too much trouble.



Early afternoon had the various rides coming back in. By the looks on the riders faces, the day had given what they wanted.

Dinner was another buffet with Awards handed out for the categories. Nic did an excellent job as MC and kept the night running smoothly and as a special treat the Club had convinced Petra Hennig to speak on her progress to undertaking BMW GS Trophy as an Australian competitor. Petra is passionate about motorbike riding and GS and always good fun to be around.







Sunday awoke to slightly warmer morning (if you can call 5 degrees warm). The 9am ride departures didn't seem to leave with the military precision seen the day before and some decided to leave even later. Maybe the conversations the night before or the good country air had made them a bit more tired.





By this time the routine was well established, bikes returned mid-afternoon, drinks were found, and stories exaggerated. It's hard to tell which day had the loudest banter through the night.

CORNER MARKING

MANY RIDES WILL UTILISE CORNER MARKING.

- The Ride Leader will indicate, by pointing, a safe location where he/she would like the **rider directly behind him/** her to mark a corner.
- The corner marker should stop in a safe place that is visible to following riders, indicate with the turn signal to following riders the route and <u>remain in position until Tail End Charlie indicates to re-join the ride</u>. Re-join the ride safely.
- If there are inexperienced riders the corner marker may need to wait for a while but remember other riders' enjoyment is dependent on your effort.
- Corner marking is utilised to allow a ride to progress in an orderly and systematic way regardless of factors that could cause a disrupted ride.
- Some of these factors include the following.
- A wide range of rider experience that would cause frustration to more experienced riders by frequently stopping
 to allow slower riders to catch up.
- Traffic conditions, e.g. frequent traffic lights, or congestion, that cause the ride to break up into groups that lose touch with one another.
- Some riders who just want to "amble" along having a leisurely ride while others go ahead.
- More often than not, especially on mid-week rides, the ride leader will decide that ride members have similar experience and ability and so corner marking can be dispensed with. This means that the ride leader needs to be able to see following riders in his/her mirrors and may prevent the ride breaking up by introducing occasional stops.

THE RIDE GUIDE

Our branch rides are all about the journey and sharing experiences and fellowship with branch riders and visitors. We should be aware of the varying experience of riders on the day and make allowances for that. In appreciation of the range of bikes and the range of rider experience we ask that each rider to do the following.

- Arrive with a full tank of fuel and an empty bladder.
- Complete the Ride Register, it is for your own safety
- Listen to the briefing by the Ride Leader.
- Know who Tail End Charlie is and what bike they are riding.
- Keep a safe distance at all times the 3 second rule is a good guide.
- Ride responsibly, obey road rules and ride at the pace that matches your own ability and skill level.
- Do not pass the Ride Leader unless the ride leader has indicated that this is acceptable. If you do pass without approval you are on your own.
- Overtake only in a different lane.
- if you leave the ride notify the Tail End Charlie and/or The Ride Leader (preferably both); and

If a visitor or new member make sure that the Ride Leader and Tail End Charlie are aware of the bike you are riding and your riding experience and ability.






EDITORS NOTE






