

To be held at the iconic <u>Kooralbyn Resort</u> set in the middle of some of best Southeast Queensland-Northern NSW motorbike riding country. Southeast Queensland in winter would be a welcome journey for many southern bikers, average temperature in June is minimum 7 and maximum 21 degrees and only a chance of slight rain for 4 days in the month. The roads in this area offer magnificent winding routes and off road for the more adventurous.







Accommodation and registration details will be sent soon, providing more detail on some of the planned events, guided and non-guided rides and also optional activities should you wish to bring non riders along or make this part of a bigger trip.







CORNER MARKING

MANY RIDES WILL UTILISE CORNER MARKING.

- The Ride Leader will indicate, by pointing, a safe location where he/she would like the rider directly behind him/ her to mark a corner.
- The corner marker should stop in a safe place that is visible to following riders, indicate with the turn signal to
 following riders the route and remain in position until Tail End Charlie indicates to re-join the ride. Re-join
 the ride safely.
- If there are inexperienced riders the corner marker may need to wait for a while but remember other riders' enjoyment is dependent on your effort.
- Corner marking is utilised to allow a ride to progress in an orderly and systematic way regardless of factors that could cause a disrupted ride.
- Some of these factors include the following.
- A wide range of rider experience that would cause frustration to more experienced riders by frequently stopping to allow slower riders to catch up.
- Traffic conditions, e.g. frequent traffic lights, or congestion, that cause the ride to break up into groups that lose touch with one another.
- Some riders who just want to "amble" along having a leisurely ride while others go ahead.
- More often than not, especially on mid-week rides, the ride leader will decide that ride members have similar
 experience and ability and so corner marking can be dispensed with. This means that the ride leader needs to be
 able to see following riders in his/her mirrors and may prevent the ride breaking up by introducing occasional
 stops.

THE RIDE GUIDE

Our branch rides are all about the journey and sharing experiences and fellowship with branch riders and visitors. We should be aware of the varying experience of riders on the day and make allowances for that. In appreciation of the range of bikes and the range of rider experience we ask that each rider to do the following.

- Arrive with a full tank of fuel and an empty bladder.
- Complete the Ride Register, it is for your own safety
- Listen to the briefing by the Ride Leader.
- Know who Tail End Charlie is and what bike they are riding.
- Keep a safe distance at all times the 3 second rule is a good guide.
- Ride responsibly, obey road rules and ride at the pace that matches your own ability and skill level.
- Do not pass the Ride Leader unless the ride leader has indicated that this is acceptable. If you do pass without approval you are on your own.
- Overtake only in a different lane.
- if you leave the ride notify the Tail End Charlie and/or The Ride Leader (preferably both); and

If a visitor or new member make sure that the Ride Leader and Tail End Charlie are aware of the bike you are riding and your riding experience and ability.



A Blast From The Past

A.V. Dodwell put wheels on roads -

In 1905 Alexander Vaughan Dodwell who lived at New Farm, Brisbane, formed the *Canada Cycle and Motor Agency (Qld) Ltd* when he (as the local manager) and with some help from others, took over the Brisbane operations of the Torontobased Canada Cycle & Motor Company (CCM).

The firm had branches in Rockhampton, Charters Towers and Townsville as well as having many agents throughout the State.

The company sold a Canadian Russell car plus a range of British cars including the Clément-Talbot and Humber, the Italian Fiat, the French Renault and Darracq plus the American Dodge and Studebaker amongst others.

CCM also sold popular brands of motorcycles including the British Triumph and BSA and the USA's Indian.

Also in the mix during the early 1900's were the Griffon Motorcycle plus Humber, Bradbury and Motor Reve machines. In those days, these machines were snapped up by those wanting less expensive motorised transport and by those with a love of speed!

There were even motorbikes converted to be delivery vehicles such as the Autocarrier. Later in the 20th Century, other motorcycles were added to the list. There was also a marine motor department.

Another offering was custom-built bodies for ambulances, buses and fire trucks including the Brisbane Ambulance Brigade's first motorised ambulance plus vehicles for the Ipswich Ambulance.

In 1910 CCM built its headquarters including a showroom and service centre on the Adelaide and Creek Sts corner which was enlarged in 1925 to a three story building which still stands today.

In 1911, the first motorised bus service between North Quay and New Farm was supplied by a 30-seater Commer bus from CCM.

From 1911, CCM faced financial difficulties which led to its closure in 1929 as an early casualty of the Depression.

BLOODBIKES

In a club of only 100 or so members, it is pleasing to see so many become involved in the Bloodbikes initiative. This is in no small part due to our TV celebrity, John Eacott espousing the virtues of this wonderful initiative that has been the lovechild of Peter Davis for a long time. Last month was the second anniversary of its Australian role.

John, surprised Peter by presenting him with a red personalised motorcycle plate BBA19 (Bloodbikes Australia and the year it started) at a coffee "meeting" in Springfield. Peter thought he was there to catch up on some administrative matters.

The attached article in Australian Motorcycle News details some of the NSW operations and they have kindly allowed us to reproduce it. Many thanks to them for helping to spread the word.

I know many of you on the Coast get the pleasure of delivering consumables from the hospital to the recipient, the drug equivalent of Meals on Wheels and the warm inner glow that comes from seeing what it means to people as they battle illness.

Recently Peter was able to convince some of the regional hospitals west of Brisbane that the service could help them. This run of 5 hospitals allows for items to be transferred between the hospitals and more importantly, samples taken back to Ipswich for testing in a timely manner. It came as a surprise to me to find out that only 80km from Brisbane, routine medical courier services don't run on a weekend. Of course that has meant we have a role to play and am glad for that. The thanks that is received from the medical staff at the time of pickup is amazing.







Blood, sweat and gears

Have you ever seen a motorcyclist riding past in a fluoro vest with BLOOD emblazoned across the back and wondered what it's all about?

here is an increasing number of volunteer motorcycle riders around the country who transport medical supplies, samples and, yes, the red stuff for hospitals and other healthcare providers.

All these riders - men and women riding everything from small-capacity cruisers to big-bore sportsbikes - are part of Bloodbikes Australia, an independent, not-for-profit outfit which provides these services at no charge to help free up more money for the delivery of healthcare. And these volunteers have been

particularly busy in recent times, providing additional capacity to deliver coronavirus tests to labs so results can be processed faster.

At present, the organisation's delivery ratio is about 80 percent Covid-related - tests, consumables and so on - 10 percent clinical trials, five percent biopsies, three percent in-home medical deliveries and two percent whole blood.

We have seen rises and falls in workload even during the pandemic," explains Bloodbikes Australia's Sydney volunteer coordinator Richard Alder. "We are also hoping to expand our range of goods carried for healthcare providers, not just Covid swab tests."

Alder points out that Bloodbikes Australia riders will transport whatever a healthcare client wishes, "as long as it can fit on our bikes," he adds.

"One of our big advantages is making better progress through traffic than a car or van."

Now operating in most Australian capital cities, plus regional centres from Moree to the Mornington Peninsula, Bloodbikes Australia was born in Queensland in 2019. Inspired by the wellestablished Bloodbikes movement in the UK and Ireland, biker Peter Davis decided to kickstart something similar in Australia.

"I had a mate volunteering for Bloodbikes Scotland and I thought what a great idea, a chance to do what I love, riding motorcycles, and doing some good at the same time," Davis recalls.

Davis says that the way Bloodbikes Australia

works is unique in the world.

"It is the first volunteer franchise where all volunteers agree to the same terms, all volunteers are totally equal, and there is no money involved at all," he explains.

"There is no fundraising, as every volunteer pays their own expenses. And the real-time cloud-based availability record that enables healthcare providers to see which volunteers are available at that moment is also unique."

The first-ever Australian deliveries undertaken by Davis and his volunteers involved transporting a variety of pathology, medicines and equipment



HOW TO GET

Bloodbikes Australia might be for you, you'll need to have more than three years riding experience, plus a reliable bike with full rego, comprehensive motorcycle insurance and a good-sized bucket or pannier on the back. You'll also need to complete an online course in blood transportation. In addition, each new rider is asked to join an experienced volunteer on an induction run.

"This is really a familiarisation run and a 'putting a face to a name' exercise," Alder explains. "It's an opportunity for the new rider to ask any final questions of the more experienced person and get familiar with the drop-off site."

for Mater Pathology in Brisbane. Next up was Griffith University's Institute for Glycomics, which is a world-leading researcher into cures for diseases such as melanoma, cervical cancer and Ross River virus.

"Then, after negotiating with the Gold Coast Hospital to tick all the boxes for more than 16 months, we made our first delivery from the hospital to a lady that had an immune-deficiency disease," Davis recalls.

"She said that our service had saved her sitting in a hospital for four hours and meant she could now stay in the comfort and safety of her infection-free home, while she gave herself the treatments we delivered.

"This made us all feel like a million dollars and is what we are all about."

Davis also remembers the satisfaction of delivering blood to a cancer patient that needed a late-night emergency transfusion.

Fast forward two years, and as the number of locations and healthcare providers increases, so also does the variety of work that Bloodbikes Australia undertakes.

"For example, we are negotiating for the transport of breast milk to premature bubs, as well as delivering the dietary requirements for people

with cancers of the stomach," Davis says,

"Furthermore, Covid and its effects will be with us for some time, and when the world focus lessens, I suspect resources will reduce and hence there could very well be more need for our free volunteer service on Covid-related transport."

At present, Bloodbikes Australia has more than 170 fully qualified, active volunteers assisting 22 healthcare providers around the country.

Davis says that he would like to have at least 400 active volunteers riding for 50 healthcare providers by the end of 2022, with more coverage in regional Australia.

"While the possibilities are not endless, there is much more room for growth - more healthcare providers, more riders, more services, more partnerships," he says.










