



Events:

We would like to see more people organise rides and ride leaders (although Gordon is happy to lead if necessary). It was also suggested that we organise weekends away. Adrian recommended a weekend to Tenterfield in July.

<u>AGM</u> President Steve suggested that (we ask John Simpson to chair the meeting on **16th July**) after he has welcomed everyone and thanked all the contributors to our club - to be confirmed.

<u>Committee Meetings</u> As it was difficult to get people to a Committee Meeting, the programme Zoom could be a solution.

<u>Raffle:</u> As there are a number of items it was decided to hold two raffles - one at the AGM and the other at the Xmas Party.

The goods include \$500 worth of vouches (\$250 fr Club + \$250 fr Ballina Motorcycles), plus items donated by Lyn and Steve.

<u>BMWCA</u> John Eacott our Club Delegate advised that under the BMWCA Club & Community Programme (BCCP) the Club may receive a sum of \$193 or \$194.

(Note: Each year clubs pay a levy of \$1 per member to BMWCA).

BMWCA will require proof of our contributions. We will therefore need a receipt from Ballina Motorcycles. Stan or Adrian will follow up.

Ride Etiquette John has suggested updating the ride etiquette published in the club's newsletter - he will attend.

CORNER MARKING

Many rides will utilise corner marking.

- The Ride Leader will indicate, by pointing, a safe location where he/she would like the rider directly behind him/ her to mark a corner.
- The corner marker should stop in a safe place that is visible to following riders, indicate with the turn signal to
 following riders the route and remain in position until Tail End Charlie indicates to re-join the ride. Re-join
 the ride safely.
- If there are inexperienced riders the corner marker may need to wait for a while but remember other riders' enjoyment is dependent on your effort.
- Corner marking is utilised to allow a ride to progress in an orderly and systematic way regardless of factors that could cause a disrupted ride.
- Some of these factors include the following.
- A wide range of rider experience that would cause frustration to more experienced riders by frequently stopping to allow slower riders to catch up.
- Traffic conditions, e.g. frequent traffic lights, or congestion, that cause the ride to break up into groups that lose touch with one another.
- Some riders who just want to "amble" along having a leisurely ride while others go ahead.
- More often than not, especially on mid-week rides, the ride leader will decide that ride members have similar
 experience and ability and so corner marking can be dispensed with. This means that the ride leader needs to be
 able to see following riders in his/her mirrors and may prevent the ride breaking up by introducing occasional
 stops.

THE RIDE GUIDE

Our branch rides are all about the journey and sharing experiences and fellowship with branch riders and visitors. We should be aware of the varying experience of riders on the day and make allowances for that. In appreciation of the range of bikes and the range of rider experience we ask that each rider to do the following.

- Arrive with a full tank of fuel and an empty bladder.
- Complete the Ride Register, it is for your own safety
- Listen to the briefing by the Ride Leader.
- Know who Tail End Charlie is and what bike they are riding.
- Keep a safe distance at all times the 3 second rule is a good guide.
- Ride responsibly, obey road rules and ride at the pace that matches your own ability and skill level.
- Do not pass the Ride Leader unless the ride leader has indicated that this is acceptable. If you do pass
 without approval you are on your own.
- Overtake only in a different lane.
- if you leave the ride notify the Tail End Charlie and/or The Ride Leader (preferably both); and

If a visitor or new member make sure that the Ride Leader and Tail End Charlie are aware of the bike you are riding and your riding experience and ability.

Poing the P'Aguilar Range the winding way

7 Intrepid riders and 2 pillions set off from BP Coomera at 7:30 last Sunday to meet me at my preferred coffee shop at 8:45. I setoff with son Cameron and friend Don from Brookfield at 7 for a leisurely ride out to Caboolture via Dayboro and Petrie. Of course this gave me an opportunity to do a site inspection of a property we manage at Caboolture....geez I was organised, except I never thought to check if the coffee shop was still in existence, it wasn't, but John Vassallo pivoted and directed us to the nearby bakery. Issue #1.

Don is very well experienced on a bike, but road riding is new to him. Having always ridden a KTM, it was going to be a big change for him to go any other way, so we had an 890 adventure bike with us. Don is still trying to work out how we got to where we did as there were areas he had never been in before. Truth be told, I was secretly very pleased when we popped out on a slightly larger road still heading North and I could see the Glass House Mountains.





With clear instructions that we would use the corner man system and head over Mt Mee, via Bellmere Road, I then missed the required corner and not wanting to do a U turn, went on to Woodford instead. The ride up to Bellthorpe along Nonmus Road is always fun and the sharp hairpin corner (you know the one if you have ever done it) is still there. Stopping at the Bellthorpe Hall I thought I should point out that we did not actually go over Mt Mee, that had been noticed by the attendees Issue #2.

Leaving the hall and heading back toward Postman's Track, I was able to successfully lose John Eacott who turned right and headed toward the Gravel road that leads to Jimna. I hadn't put a corner marker at the hall road exit. Issue #3.

It took a while to notice that John wasn't there and by the time he had phone reception again we sorted out where we were relative to him.

They say things happen for a reason, little did I know we were meant to stop on this particular section of road so that a very large Kangaroo could take a good look over us, if we hadn't been waiting for John, I doubt we would have noticed the fine specimen.

Underway again, we then had the pleasure of doing Postman's Track and running along

the Mary Valley, that route never gets dull.

Obi Obi Road was on the agenda, so through Kenilworth we headed, but not before roadworks split us up at the redlight regulated road works. I had promised no dirt unless Council was doing repairs, so I dodged that complaint as it was clearly stated in the ride disclaimer.



Lunch spot at Montville was recommended and I think the recommendation was well earnt. Its not often that I see members also having fancy deserts.

Parking in Montville is a challenge and obviously the locals had not got my memo about leaving space for 10 bikes outside the café, so we had to walk. Issue #4

The riding conditions and weather couldn't have been better, although Don did look at bit envious when we spoke of using the heated hand grips, apparently the 890 doesn't have them as standard, I have sent him the link to after-market heated grips.

The plan was then through Maleny for fuel, down Bald Knob Road and Commissioners Flat on the way home.

I am guessing there was a traffic accident in the direction we wanted to go, the road was closed and we needed to back track. This has meant we will need to organise another ride to actually do Bald Knob Road and Commissioners Flat, maybe later this year????

Some were going to go home via Fernvale, whilst I was going to lead the rest over Mt Mee and onto the Western Freeway/Logan Motorway. Cameron and Don had swapped bikes so our last pull over gave them a chance to get back on their own steads, by this time everyone was going back my way as the day had passed quickly and we seemed to be getting later and later.

Getting 10 bikes corralled and through the various traffic lights from Samford through the back of Mt Cootha and onto the Western Freeway was a challenge and thanks to John for blocking some of the other traffic lanes so we could get as many though at once as possible.

I often feel a foreigner when following the club through the back of the Gold Coast, well this was my turn to reverse the tables, most had zero idea of where we were or where we going to come out, so they stuck close to me.

All up, 394km for me, I think John Eacott was 486km and Greyden got home just before 7pm and nearly 600km. I for one slept very well that night.


