

# KEN'S CHRISTMAS RIDE

The period between Xmas and 4th January allows me time to get away and drive the cooler areas around the Victorian highlands, this year was no different, except it would have been cooler in Qld. On the ride down I rode with Steve, another real estate agent that I have known for many years. He was on the way to Tasmania to meet up with his wife and then ride two up around Tassie for a few days. Whilst we zig zagged through New South Wales we did as many of the winding non highways as possible and then discussed bike rides and real estate of a night. I think Gordon would agree that that could qualify as a work trip.



Leaving Steve after Cooma put me on track for the Barry Way, but as the winds of 60-80Kmh made the day very unpleasant I stopped at Jindabyne in hope of doing the Barry Way on a more pleasant day. A day later and having done the Barry Way (and it never fails to impress) I was stopped on the Great Alpine Road taking a photo of the bike and scenery when who comes the other way, Steve who had just done Mt Hotham. He complained of excessive grit on the road at the top of Mt Hotham. I came through the day after and for 15km they had put grit down to bind the melting tar.

During the time away, it was mid to high 30's every day and got to a maximum of 42.5, doesn't the helmet smell good when putting it on the next day.

The standout accommodation was the <u>Blue Duck Inn at Anglers Rest</u> near Omeo. One of Victoria's oldest operating pubs. Crystal clear water where people fished for trout and separate room for accommodation. Spent 2 nights there I liked it that much, new years eve with the publican and the few locals playing trivial pursuit was a hoot and I even made it to 9:30 Victorian time. Having done the high Country Safari earlier in the year I came across some of the ride sections, in particular Mt Benambra, (a shortcut which usually means the longest way back) from Dartmouth toward Corryong. On the Safari, I remember it as rough rocky road, but no big issue, when by myself and running a softer tyre and only seeing 3 vehicles in the 2 hours I was there, I felt very alone. The 41.5 degrees and less water than needed didn't make the day any better although the locals at Corryong certainly helped.

Local knowledge said there was a great ride from Adaminaby to Tharwa (toward Canberra). Went via Cabramurra (highest inhabited township in Australia) and being repopulated as the site for staff for the Snowy 2.0, they were expecting site huts to arrive the following week.

The road to Tharwa took me through Namadgi National park and into Canberra. It was a well graded road and I think most of the road bikes could do it, but there was about 70km of gravel.

During the ride I had decided to break the trip and rather than rush home for my daughters birthday, actually slow down and break the trip. I called in to meet a couple of my agent friends in Canberra and of course we discussed real estate, so again I would class that as work. I even took one for a ride around the outskirts and through the surrounding hills. I then left the bike at Canberra airport and flew home for a few days. This enabled me to see my son who had come up from Melbourne so I had the 4 kids at home and Nicks partner, plus I got to host an 18<sup>th</sup> birthday and do some work just after new year before flying back down.


I am going to do this in the future. It made the ride feel like two separate holidays and there was no temptation just to get home. I Zig Zagged back up as if I hadn't been on a bike for a while and needed to get some miles done.

All up 4605km, 207 litres, 6076 gear changes and 51.74 hours on the bike = huge fun. I also got 2 deals agreed whilst away.

#### 2018 Bike sales - 3 Awards for BMW Motorrad

<u>BMW Motorrad's K 1600B</u> - Grand America has been awarded 'Bike of the Year - Touring Segment'.

The 364kg K 1600 B Grand America is a 'full-dress' version of the K 1600 B Bagger. Standard features include: heated seats, feet-forward footboards, cruise control, electric screen, keyless ride, adaptive headlight, electronic suspension, reverse gear, bi-directional quickshifter and central locking. Also added are a top box with integrated passenger backrest and a higher level of standard specification compared to the donor.

In the Adventure Sport Segment, for the 3rd year in a row, the *S* 1000 XR was awarded **'Bike of the Year - Adventure Sport Segment'**. Standard features include: BMW Motorrad Race ABS, Heated Grips, On Board Computer, Centre Stand, ASC and Rain and Road Riding Modes.'

The <u>BMW *G* 310 GS</u> awarded **Bike of the Year** in the **Adventure Sport LAMS Segment**. Included as standard are: BMW Motorrad ABS, Gold brake calipers, low-wear standard tyres and a luggage carrier.

Once each category winner is settled, nine of them (excluding motocross and Enduro) are taken on a three-day road ride to Tasmania to gain a greater appreciation for their relative strengths and weaknesses.

The demonstrations were held during the Global Consumer Technology Event.

#### Motorcycling tip

For those who have hard panniers with a smooth inner surface and have the problem of the contents therein sliding about, a cheap solution (if one doesn't have inner bags), is to purchase self-adhesive rubber mats for the insides. A 450sqm rubber mat may be purchased from Bunnings at \$4.98 each.




